

Thång Per Olof 1995. **Unskilled Workers in Swedish Industry. Views of Education and Need for Learning. Experiences from three case studies.**

– Since the early 1970s, the Department of Pedagogics at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, has conducted extensive research on the subject of adult education and learning. In most part, these studies have focused on poorly educated people and their educational situation. The article is based on three mutually different studies and the results obtained. The enterprises studies consist of the following: a fairly large food industry warehouse, a food processing plant and a factory producing audio equipment for the automobile industry. The studies looked into matters such as qualification requirements connected to jobs and the attitudes and expectations of the personnel and the company executives to training aimed at poorly educated manual workers.

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
